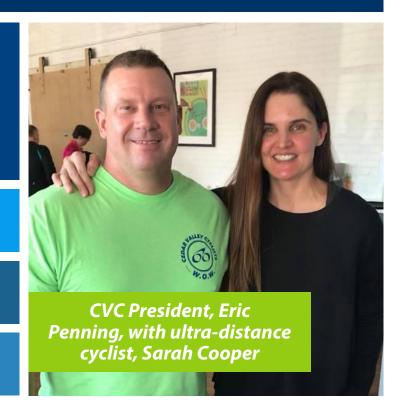
I'd like to thank Sarah Cooper, SingleSpeed Waterloo, and everyone who came out on March 3 for Sarah's presentation. She talked about how she got

SAVE THE DATE | JUNE 16-17

Cedar Valley Cyclists is pleased to host the 7th Annual Lake 2 Lake Ride. The ride begins at 9 a.m. with registration starting at 8 a.m. on June 16 at George Wyth State Park in the parking lot just west of the beach house.

Riders will travel 50 miles through the Iowa River Valley's lush green rolling hills to the overnight camping location in Pine Ridge Park in Steamboat Rock. The route consists of trails from George Wyth State Park through Cedar Falls, then follows several county roads to reach Pine Ridge Park. There will be stops in several towns along the way, including Dike, Wellsburg, and Steamboat Rock. Riders will return to Waterloo-Cedar Falls by the same route.

There is a new optional 100 mile route this year. There will be a spot on your registration form to indicate that is the route you are planning. Be prepared to start your day an hour early.

The fee is \$35.00 for CVC members and \$45.00 for non-members.

The cost for registering after the deadline for both is \$55.00.

BIKE ADVOCACY UPDATE

(Excerpt from Iowa Bicycle Coalition report)

The Bike Safety Bill (HF2341) has died at the Iowa Legislature because it failed the second "funnel."

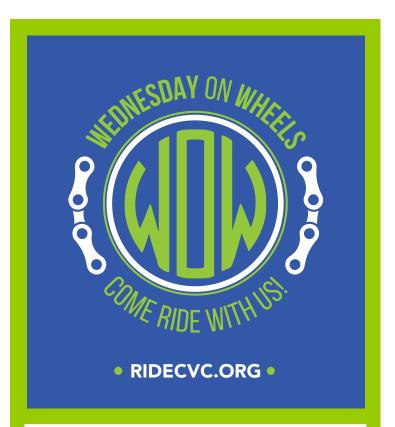
It isn't surprising because the conversation had not changed from the year before. An amendment added a mandatory hi-vis requirement for roads with speed limits above 45 MPH and added a criminal penalty if the bicyclist did not display 144 square inches of hi-vis material. The lowa Bicycle Coalition, PeopleForBikes, and a large majority of cyclists opposed the hi-vis mandate.

It has been said over and over, but it bears repeating: cyclists aren't against hi-vis material and most encourage bicyclists to be visible for safety. The problem was the specific mandate and transferring the burden exclusively to the cyclists. This law was supposed to be about driving safely around bicyclists, stopping motorists from buzzing them on the road, teaching student drivers how to safely pass, and ultimately, stop motorists from running over bicyclists. The lowa Bicycle Coalition board and government relations committee understood the difficulty and couldn't support passing a bad bill, so it failed for the year.

If there is a silver lining, it is bicyclists have a voice and that voice is organized. In less than 3 weeks, bicyclists sent over 1,500 emails to their lowa House members in all 100 House districts. We advanced the conversation further than ever before. Thanks to everyone who sent an email, tweet, or message to their legislator. Thanks to the families of bicyclists killed by motorists who urged us to keep moving forward.

lowa Bicycle Coalition now starts preparing for the next two-year legislative session, especially on stronger advocacy tools and a new legislative package. Input, ideas, and advice from members and all cyclists will be needed to keep moving forward.

P.S. This session isn't over. Work continues on state trail funding, conservation trust funding, and the standing appropriations bill. Watch the website in the upcoming weeks to learn how you can help.

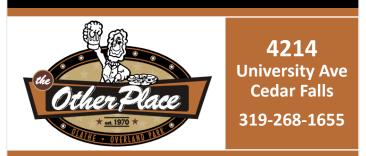
